

**RESORT VILLAGE OF KANNATA VALLEY  
REFUSE MANAGEMENT  
Bylaw 75.2**

***The Council of the Resort Village of Kannata Valley in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts the following articles and provisions:***

**PURPOSE**

1. The purpose of this bylaw is to regulate the use of the publicly funded Refuse Transfer Station and to change the bylaw name from "Garbage/Landfill" to Refuse Management.

**DEFINITION OF TERMS:**

2. The following definitions and the definitions contained in the Act apply to this bylaw

Act	The Refuse Management Regulation under the Environmental Management and Protection Act and amendments thereto
Local Authority (LA)	the council of the Resort Village of Kannata Valley
Administrative Authority (AA)	the Ministry of Environment of the Province of Saskatchewan
Municipality	the Resort Village of Kannata Valley
Council	the administrative body of the Municipality comprised of a mayor and councillors.
Property Owner	the person(s) or corporation listed as owner of private property in the municipality
Occupant	the person(s) using property in the municipality as owner or leaseholder
Refuse Transfer Utility	the utility operated by the municipality to manage the disposition of refuse.
Refuse Transfer Station (RTS)	all that portion of municipal property zoned CS1 set aside for the collection of refuse
Refuse	means the remains, by-products, and discarded materials resulting from domestic activities and includes garbage, rubbish, street cleanings, yard clippings etc.
Garbage	the animal, mineral and vegetable waste and their containers resulting from the handling, preparation and cooking of food
Rubbish	putrescible remains and by-products, consisting of both combustible and non-combustible remains and by-products, and includes paper, cardboard, tin cans, wood, glass, crockery, by-products of building construction activities.
3. The operation of the Refuse Transfer Station (RTS) shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Act
4. The LA may regulate, control and fix a schedule of fees for disposal of all or specific types and volumes of refuse in the (RTS) site
5. The LA may enter into agreements with other communities for disposal of all or specific types and volumes of refuse in the RTS.
6. Persons authorized to use the RTS shall have access to "Green Bins" via a padlocked gate to deposit bags of Refuse classified as Garbage from sunrise to sunset on any day.
7. The LA shall provide a key for the padlock to authorized persons subject to the following conditions:
  - a) A \$20.00 refundable deposit is paid to the municipality for each key.
  - b) Keys will not be duplicated and distributed by a property owner
  - c) The deposit will be retained by the municipality where a key is lost, broken or not returned.
8. Persons authorized to use the RTS for refuse listed in Article 9 & 10 of this bylaw will have access to the refuse collection sites during the following hours of operation subject to exceptions listed in Article 8:
  - a) **Winter Hours of Operation** - October 1<sup>st</sup> to April 30<sup>th</sup>
    - Wednesday 10:00AM to 12:00 Noon
    - Saturday 10:00AM to 12:00 Noon
  - b) **Summer Hours of Operation** – May 1<sup>st</sup> to September 30<sup>th</sup>
    - Wednesday 10:00AM to 12:00 Noon
    - Saturday 10:00AM to 12:00 Noon
    - Sunday 10:00AM to 12:00 Noon
    - Holiday Mondays: 10:00AM to 12:00 Noon

9. The *RTS* shall be closed the 24<sup>th</sup>, 25<sup>th</sup> & 26<sup>th</sup> of December and the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January. The LA may close the *RTS* on any other days scheduled in Article 8 where prior notification is provided in compliance with the Public Notice Bylaw
10. **Refuse permitted** for deposit into the large “roll-off bin” are:
  - a) By-products from building construction in limited quantities. i.e .insulation, lumber, plywood, shingles, siding etc. **Note: Products of building demolition are not permitted without prior LA approval.**
  - b) Cardboard, packing materials, newsprint,
  - c) porcelain toilets & sinks, plastics, poly pipe & hoses, insulation, lawn furniture etc
  - d) **Paint** and/or paint containers
  - e) **Electronics:** Televisions, radios, computers, printers etc
11. **Refuse permitted** for deposit in collection areas designated as:
  - a) **Able to be composted:** Lawn and garden vegetation
  - b) **Able to be shredded:** tree trunks and branches less than 8” diameter, shrubs and leaves
  - c) **Diseased Trees:** tree trucks, branches & leaves from trees certified to be infected with the Dutch Elm beetle.
  - d) **Metal:** Iron, steel and aluminium products suitable for disposal as scrap
  - e) **Batteries:** Acid and solid core batteries
  - f) **Soil:** Limited products from excavation that is void of trees, roots, concrete & rubble, subject to LA prior approval.
12. All *refuse* must be separated and placed in the appropriate collection bins/containers or other areas as designated by the *RTS* Operator.
13. Persons authorized to use the *RTS* shall deposit only that *Refuse* that was generated from within the boundaries of the municipality or, by agreement, from other communities. *Refuse* generated in residences within other municipalities or other than those authorized by agreement, are not permitted without LA approval.
14. No person shall deposit *refuse* prohibited by any Act, bylaw or the *RTS* Operator which includes but may not be limited by the following:
  - a) Refrigerators, stoves, dishwashers, hot water heaters, furnaces, air conditioners,
  - b) Mattresses, sofas, chairs, household furniture, lawn furniture and other refuse deemed bulky and oversized by the *RTS* operator.
  - c) Propane, gasoline, oil, and other combustibles and/or their containers
  - d) Pesticides, chemicals and their containers
  - e) Equipment (vehicles, trailers, boats )bodies and frames etc
  - f) All types of vehicular tires & including tires used as boat dock bumpers.
  - g) Sewage
15. A person who fails, neglects or refuses to separate their *refuse* or deposits *refuse* in an area other than that which is in accordance with this bylaw is in breach of this bylaw and shall, at their own expense, correct the wrongdoing or, when in default of such work be liable for the cost of such remedial work. The LA may recover the expense thereof, with costs, in any court of competent jurisdiction or in like manner as taxes.
16. The LA owns and has sole right to dispose of all *refuse* delivered to the site.
17. Persons authorized to use the site for the disposal of *refuse* may take away any material from the metals collection area at their own risk and for their own use. Persons not authorized to use the site may only remove materials, object or things from the site with prior permission of the municipality.
18. Transporting *refuse* over any public highway requires the load to be secured in a manner that assures that no part(s) of the load fall off or are blown off from the transporting vehicle.
19. *Refuse* shall not be left on any public street or highway or near the gate of the site
20. No person shall start a fire within the *RTS* unless authorized by the LA

21. No person shall deface, destroy or alter any signs, gates or fencing at the site.

**PENALTIES**

22. A person who, after having been given an official Notice of Violation again contravenes any of the provisions of this bylaw or fails to comply with any notice or order given there under is guilty of an offence and liable to an action in accordance with the provisions of the municipal Penalty Bylaw.

**SEVERABILITY**

23. A decision of a Court that one or more provisions of this bylaw are invalid in whole or in part does not affect the validity, effectiveness or enforceability of the other provisions or parts of the provisions of this bylaw.

**REFERENCE BYLAWS**

24. Bylaw 75.1 is hereby repealed

**EFFECTIVE DATE**

25. THIS BYLAW comes into force and takes effect immediately after having received third reading.
